F. Lewis, I have been in constant contact with the NSWMA who have indicated that they have been facing a resource problem as the one garbage truck that serves the parish has been down regularly. I have also spoken to the Minister, who has assured that he will see to an additional allocation of resources to ensure that the situation is rectified. J. Elliott, Getting water into our homes and farms is my number one priority. A number of communities have never had any water supply, while others are faced with irregular water supply. I have already met with the Minister of Water, the Chairman of the NWC and NIC and the local NWC and NIC teams to craft a way forward. We will start by expanding the network using the resources that we have already identified and have access to, that way increasing regularity in areas that have and extending into areas that dont have. We will also explore new sources for increasing supply and piping for areas that dont have. I am committed to work towards fixing this problem
