
# CONSTITUENCY DEVELOPMENT FUND REPORT – 2019/2020

This document provides a summary of South St. Andrew's Constituency Development Fund (CDF) expenditures for the Fiscal Year April 2019 through March 2020.

#### Education - CDF Allocation - \$5,000,000.00

Back-to-school support was provided to hundreds of families in the constituency in the form of book vouchers, uniforms, school bags, stationery and part payment of tuition and CSEC Fees in the Constituency through the Constituency Development Fund (CDF) and additional resources arranged by the Member of Parliament. The Member of Parliament also arranged financial bursaries to over 70 Grade 6 students from the constituency who achieved an average grade of over 80% in their Primary Exit Profile (PEP) Examination, and assisted over 30 students during the period with Education Grants towards the costs of attending various Universities and Colleges under his ongoing programme of support for students from the constituency who are pursuing tertiary education.


## Social Housing Programme - \$2,500,000.00

Over 100 persons were provided housing assistance through the Constituency Development Fund allocation of \$2.5 Million Dollars, in the form of small grants for materials for much-needed home repairs and upgrades.











During the period, the Member of Parliament also provided funds for Zinc sheeting to assist residents and small community businesses across the Constituency.

#### **Sports Programme - \$2,500,000.00**



The Constituency Development Fund's allocation for Sports continues to play a key role in supporting Arnett Gardens Football Club and the Boys Town Football Club, and also sponsoring various community sports events.

Funding was provided for sporting gear, equipment, medals and trophies.



## **Employment Generation - \$3,000,000.00**



Through the allocation for Employment Generation, work was done on community projects, employing more than over 200 persons in labour and usage of equipment.







## Emergency & Welfare Programme - \$3,000,000.00

Through the CDF's Emergency and Welfare allocation over 100 constituents received funeral grants and medical assistance for medication, diagnostic tests and surgery.









Many unfortunate fire victims in the constituency were also assisted under the CDF's Emergency and Welfare allocation, supplemented by resources mobilized by the Member of Parliament from Food for the Poor, various state agencies and private sector donors.





#### Administrative Assistant - \$1,500,000.00

A mandatory allocation of \$1.5 million is used to engage an Administrative Assistant to ensure that, in addressing the needs of the constituents in South St. Andrew, the expenditure of CDF resources is executed in accordance with the Government's applicable protocols/guideline governing the Constituency Development Fund.



#### **Economic Enablement Allocation - \$2,000,000.00**

This allocation assisted over 50 micro/small business operators to start or expand their businesses, through grants for working capital or to purchase equipment needed for their business operations.





## **Labour Day Allocation - \$500,000.00**

Several community projects across the constituency were supported by the CDF'smandatory Labour Day allocation.
