

2022 Annual Reports

This report highlights some of our initiatives throughout the calendar year 2021. It does not in any way shape or form capture everything that has been done through the year in question, however, this report will give an idea of the projects that were initiated.

This report will be distributed to all the Citizens Association Presidents for dissemination to the citizens within their individual communities. Also, citizens can request information from the Access to Information Act, and information can be sent to constituents by contacting the office.

I have hosted two Constituency Development Fund consultations: one with just the Presidents of the various registered groups with Social Development Corporation (SDC) and the other March 17, 2021, with Mrs Kedesha Campbell, along with Presidents and leaders of the various groups in the constituency. This meeting was held virtually due to the pandemic which was well attended. At that meeting, information was given as to how the first CDF was spent and together, we made plans as to how the upcoming CDF will be spent in the constituency for 2021-2022, we all concluded as to the way forward.

Presentations were made from CDF personnel, presidents for the various associations present and the Social Development Corporation (SDC).

Education

- Over 87 persons benefited from grants for tertiary education.
- Over 25 students benefited with tuition and exam fees and exam fees for the Caribbean Secondary Education Council (CSEC).
- Over 5 computers were distributed to members in the constituency
- Over 50 iPads were distributed to students of Portsmouth Primary School courtesy of Ministry of Education and Youth, also the Ministry of Transport and Mining courtesy of the Transport Toll Authority (Not CDF)
- Over 100 ipads were distributed to citizens in the Constituency courtesy of the Most Hon. Prime Minister's Foundation, positive Foundation. (Not CDF)
- 10 iPads were donated to Cumberland High School. (Not CDF)
- Learn with Robert Miller was introduced in the constituency virtually in April 2021. This
 program assisted over 600 students, preparing them for their CSEC classes in seven
 disciplines: Mathematics, Information Technology, English Language, Human and Social
 Biology, Principles of Business and Principles of Accounts. Teachers in various disciplines
 were selected from the constituency. (Not CDF)



Social Housing:

Over 120 constituents benefited from the social housing program, which includes building grants, painting and enhancements of one's property.

An additional 1 Million was obtained from the Ministry of Housing to build a house for an elderly couple in the Westchester Area. They were also placed on the government pension program. The house was tiled, painted and fencing erected by Heart TrustNTA.





Welfare & Emergency

129 persons benefited from this programmes' areas of focus which assisted in the following program:

- Prescription
- Medical expenses
- Blood work
- Business Assistance
- Funeral Grants
- X-rays





Health:

Through the efforts of my office, I sought assistance from the Ministry of Health & Wellness in terms of sponsoring medical expenses for constituents. A total of \$3,506,995.95 was obtained from the Ministry with medical expenses for a total of 6 persons. Chronic operations from cancer and mainly diabetes. **(Not CDF)**



CHASE:

A total of \$379, 701.50 was obtained from the entity mainly for persons seeking dialysis treatment, one person benefited. (Not CDF)



Economic Enablement:

Due to different circumstance, many individuals lost their jobs, and many are faced with the fear of losing their jobs. Families are unable to satisfy their basic needs hence, children have been denied the privilege of attending school because their parents are unable to find lunch money and provide them with the basic resources for school, also the elderly are being denied access to proper health care and mediation.

These individuals are shop owners, cabinet makers, mechanics and other small business owners. Assistance for these micro businesses will be provided in the form of replenishing of stocks for the grocery shop operators, materials for cabinet makers/other skilled workers and support for other viable business ventures.

With this assistance individuals will be able to continue business successfully thus contributing to growth in the constituency and the economy at large.

A total of 56 persons benefited from this program.

Sports

The pandemic caused sporting activities in the constituency to stand still. A total of \$365,910 was spent during the period on various activities listed below:

- Westchester netball team, balls, bibs, gears, coaching outfits
- Table Tennis board for Bridgeport Community Centre
- Registration for the Edgewater Football Team
- Paying for the coaching program of the Edgewater Coach Jamaica Football Federation certification
- Trophies and balls for Cumberland Meadows Sports Day
- Tent for Portmore Missionary School



St. Catherine South Eastern Disaster Mitigation

The constituency has several floods–prone areas. There is also a large network of lateral and cross drains that require cleaning and maintenance to reduce the impact in the event of severe weather.

It is also worthy of mention that blockages of drainage around the public thoroughfare within the constituency has contributed to the deterioration of roadways and in some instances, overgrown vegetation gets in the way of power lines and threatens public safety. This is a key priority for citizens as they foresee the risk to life and property that could be impacted by flooding, or a major earthquake, or the overall negative impact that these unplanned events can have on the lives of persons living in these areas.

A decision has therefore been taken to make this allocation available for the cleaning of critical drains and gullies, removing overgrowth as well as to help return normalcy to the lives of individuals who might be affected should a disaster occur.

The drains that were cleaned are as follows:


- Port Henderson Road
- Drain from Portmore Heart Academy to Big Buy Plaza Portmore Mall



Road Works:

The following roads were done from funding obtained from the National Work Agency. The roads are as follows:

- Waterford Parkway
- Portmore Drive
- George Lee Blvd
- West Trade Way
- East Trade Way
- Cumberland Blvd







Christmas Mitigation Program:

The Most Honourable Prime Minister of Jamaica Andrew Holness, gave all Members of Parliament 16 million JMD during the Christmas Holiday period which the breakdown is as follows:

De-bushing

- Port Henderson Road


Painting

All major roads in all divisions. This program was implemented through National Work Agency.

Removal of Bulky Waste

This program was implemented in all Divisions through National Solid Waste and Management Agency.





Road Patching:

I decided that I would not embark on the road patching exercise instead I would use the resources to resurface two blocks in the Garveymeade area. This has not been implemented yet. However, word from the National Work Agency is that a contract was awarded and signed, and work will commence within the next two weeks.



Drain Cleaning/Sanitization:

The following gullies below were cleaned with the resources through the National Works Agency.

- Curtesan Way Gully/Gaza Gully (Caymanas Drive to Adair Drive) Waterford
- Kriterion Gully/Tulloch Gully (Caymanas to Adair Drive) Waterford
- New Forum Fishing Village (Sanitization)



Mitigation Funding:

2 million JMD was given for preparation for the hurricane season, the following drains were cleaned:


- Drain by Coral Way to Port Henderson Primary
- A portion of drain by Passage Fort

Sewage Collapse and Repair:

Sewage continues to place a serious issue within the constituency. This matter has been a threat to the constituents in terms of health and standard of living. The following areas had a collapse which was corrected, however some of the areas are yet to be resurfaced.

- Portsmouth
- Coral Way
- Waterford Parkway
- Fray Close
- Yale Way
- Excelsior Avenue





Community Outreach and Interaction:

I continue to have regular interaction with members of the community. This is done by the following:

- Regular visitation for persons in the constituency
- Regular door to door walks in communities
- Being present at various community activities

- Regular meetings with Principals and School Board Chairmen


